- Ops Team

- GovDelivery subscribers are at 87,362 and that number continues to grow.
- o A Powerpoint presentation with data was reviewed.
- The FOG mobile device app was completed late last year. In the last 30 days it had 7.6K users compared to only 20,000 users the entire year in 2022.

### **Old Business**

#### Update presented by Fennessy/Marshalll

- \*MACS 410-4 FIRESCOPE Approved By-Laws Review
  - Document review and discussion.
- Complex Incident Management Transition and its impact on CICCS
  - Chief Vail gave an overview of the history.
  - In August, responded to a letter from CWCG regarding the transition.

- Per Board majority, we are not going to participate until we can evaluate CIM and its impact on CICCS.
- We have had meetings with the Region 5 Forest Service and they have been supportive of our position.
- ▶ 41% of CWCG teams are local government personnel.
- Committed to developing our Type III IMTs for local government.
- Looking for a path from Type III IMT's to Type I IMT's much like CAL FIRE has done in their 4039 manual.
- > California is affected more than other states.
- Assessing the position of FEMA NIMS in relation to CIM.
- This year, the team selections will be the same as they have been before. The real impact will be coming in 2024.
- We are invested deeply in CICCS.
- The intent is to remove the identification of Type I and Type II Incident Management Teams from IROC when going into the CIM criteria. This is still a discussion item. We will have to decide if we are going to stick to our course of Type I and Type II typing. We would have to request California only typing. The other question is, what is an alternative to IROC?
- Will keep as an agenda item for further discussion at the April BoD and possibly the July BoD.

#### **New Business**

## Update presented by Fennessey/Marshall/Rice/Gardner

- \*Prop 19 & Senate Bill 450 Fire District Funding
  - Presentation was given by Rice
  - Chief Fennessey gave a brief history.
  - Presently there is no funding behind it. But, there will be in the future.
  - We don't want to be caught off guard and an administrative structure is needed prior to the funding being provided.
  - A Board subcommittee will be formed to guide the establishment of the Admin structure.
  - Next steps:
    - Develop the application forms that Special Districts will use to apply for Prop 19 funding (when it is available)
      - -Recommendation: Base these applications on applications for existing OES grant programs and the federal SAFER grant program, consistent with SB 450.

- -Recommendation: Use this unfunded year as a time to establish the process so that, as funding becomes available, applications from Special Districts can commence without delay.
- Remain diligent in tracking funding each year, work closely with DOF to continue calculations.
