Review and Approval of October Meeting Minutes – Serrano

Task Force Update - Serrano

- Two new members officially recognized as voting members:
 - Jim Henery (ORC)
 - Chris Landry (EDH)

Ops Team Update – Johnstone

- Chief Johnstone indicates a discussion occurred that could increase Ops team meetings from two in-person per year to four per year.
- Emphasizes the need to get "Docs package" to Ops team one week prior to Ops meeting so that members can read the documents.
- AB2380 emphasized as a sensitive document. A "Guidance Document" has been sent to Chief Fennessy for review with President of CPF Brian Rice.
 - Labor (in the form of CPF), Incident Safety, Wildland, Task force will also have input on editing the "Guidance Document"
- California Mutual Aid Advisory Group is getting a name change to Mutual Aid Coordination Team (MACT).
- Ops team has a subgroup working on 410-1 and MACs Guidance. On main change will be the wire diagram Org. chart.

Cal OES Update – Johnson

- Demonstrates modernization and organization of CAL OES FIRESCOPE website. Shows a variety of external resources. Staff continues to make improvements to ADA compliance for documents.
- Demonstrates that Subcommittees have streamlined, organized places on each subpage for Rosters, Plans of Work, Charts, and associated documents. Each subpage has a historical record for publications that is organized by year.
 - There is a 45-day posting requirement for meeting notes. Flyers must be posted due to the Brown Act. This act explains that meetings are public.
 - Point of clarification All documents that must go through review must go through the Specialist Group, Task Force, Ops Team, and ultimately the BoD. All other documents can be uploaded directly into SmartSheets.
- OES IT is working with Salesforce for an app that crosses multiple platforms.

OSFM Report - Petty

- Serrano gives update in place of: A document crafted by Petty indicates that invoicing program, curriculum updates, and other projects are all ongoing with no significant changes to report.
- Chief Lewis provides the Tower Rescue update. New classes will be using the new curriculum starting in March of 2024.
- Rope Rescue will phase out old curriculum in 2024.
- All Task Books are moving toward ADA Compliance and to be housed in the CAL OES Website platform.
- Discussion on each Subcommittee having a social media presence. This has been past approved practice. Each Subcommittee will need to designate an approved monitor and post fresh content. Yesenia from CAL OES can serve as a point of contact.
