1. Masoner covered what was talked about at the special Operations Team Meeting of December 8th. Problems identified at this meeting are the same ones we have talked about for the last two years. Program Office will put together the notes on the meeting and let the Task Force know if there is any work to be done by the Task Force.
2. Reviewed Operations Team Meeting notes of November 20 and 21. Action items for Task Force that came out of this meeting were ones already identified in their plan of work, except for "Assure Dispatchers input is acquired during the development of the order processing module and other related programs," which is a FIRESCOPE Program Office responsibility to identify those people through the Operations Team.
3. Discussion on forming of Technical Content Groups to work on Lesson Plans for the Planning/Logistics work groups at CDF Fire Academy, Ione Cal. Task Force Chairman to prepare recommendation for Operations Team Meeting in January 1981.
4. Request was made for SITSTAT at OCC and CDF Ione to have their own three letter identifier for access to the computer. Task Force recommended that both get a three letter identifier. Program Office to handle. Cook said no one will be given an identifier for use of the computer until they have received computer training.
5. Reviewed the New Form 209. Task Force accepted the New Form as presented and asked Creel to work with computer people on getting it in the computer. Looked good, Creel to prepare final copy of 209.
6. MACS Development. Talked about Resource Data Base for MACS needs.
 1. MACS resources inventory.
 2. Identify what the agencies feel are the combined resource (primary/support/special) list should be.
 3. Priority.LAC Creel to get resource inventory book to computer people to look at.

Need to get more information to Task Force on how the County/State Emergency Service Coordination System functions. Scherr to invite someone to Task Force meeting in early January 81 to explain the system. This is needed for MACS goal #1 and others.
7. After much discussion during the two (2) days the general feeling of the Task Force members is to recommend to the Operations Team the following (in priority) relating to Communication Units.

- Priority #1 Spend FIRESCOPE money to bring agency owned Comm. units to minimum or ideal standard.
- Priority #2 Spend FIRESCOPE money to bring OES Comm. unit #6 to ideal standard.
- Priority #3 Have FIRESCOPE Program Office to purchase trailer and equipment to meet ideal standard.

Comm. Specialist Group will have to do some work on what size trailer is needed to meet the ideal standard.

8. Strike Team Leader Slide/Tape program is completed. Task Force recommends the 10 slide/tapes be distributed as follows:

1-to each agency	7
1-to State Fire Marshall (training)	1
2-to Support/Services Manager for library	2

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9. Discussion on the FIRESCOPE FY81 budget. The Task Force recommends the following items in priority for additional funds, in and above items 1 through 12 on Arnie's rough draft sheet of 12-2-80.

- Priority 1 Agency Support
- 2 Comm. Unit
- 3 Additional radios
- 4 High speed telecopier (2 each)
- 5 TI-59
- 6 Pagers for S&R, IC, etc.
- 7 Additionl Maps
- 8 OCC Support
- 9 Increase Data Base
- 10 Additional weather station's

Items #4, #5, and #6 were not on Arnie's rough draft.

10. Task Force reviewed and revised the remaining computer terminal locations list.
